

Features of the Fifth Force from Paul Pearsall , Ph.D.
Chapter 3 from "The Heart's Code"

1. "L" energy travels faster than the speed of light.
2. "L" energy is "nonlocal" or free of the limits of space and time as we know them. It is everywhere at the same time, meaning that tuning into this energy is not as much a matter of "sending or receiving" as "connecting."
3. "L" energy passes unchanged through any known substance and nothing shields or deflects it.
4. "L" energy is often accompanied by an electromagnetic field and the other of the four known forms of energy (gravity, electromagnetism, and weak and strong nuclear energy) but is different from all these forms of energy in its power, measurability, conduction, speed, and reception.
5. The heart is uniquely composed of "L" energy and communicates it in its own form but also "piggybacked" on the electromagnetic field (EMF) created by the heart.
6. "L" energy fills all of space in the form of bundles of vibrating energy that can manifest themselves as either particles or waves that contain the information transmitted within, and to, all persons and things.
7. "L" energy is often conducted effectively by denser materials but seems to be refracted by more solid or metal objects and absorbed faster and better by organic material such as humans, animals, and plants.
8. "L" energy is not only nonlocal (everywhere) but also negentropic (does not fall apart and disappear), formative (creative and not destructive), and organizing (integrative and not divisive) in its effects, the exact opposite of the effects from Newton's second Law of thermodynamics and the entropy it predicts--- that everything is gradually falling apart.
9. Changes in "L" energy precede physical or observable biophysical changes.
10. "L" energy is the energy related to quantum occurrences, meaning that it operates by the principles of nonlocality, relativity, and freedom from Newtonian principles of linear time

and space. When we are tuned into our "L" energy, we can experience a sense of freedom from time and space constraints.

11. Although it is not typically revealed to the see/touch world, "L" energy occasionally reveals itself in various observable ways, such as spirals, a cloud surrounding the body (aura), glowing, etheric webs, etc.
12. While it is likely that "L" energy's nonlocality means that it is everywhere, there sometimes seem to be tracings of its presence that make it look as if it is flowing back and forth from one person and object to another.
13. A principle related to nonlocality is called Bell's Theorem. This is a quantum physics law that says that once connected, objects affect one another forever no matter where or when they are. Following the principle of Bell's theorem, "L" energy seems to be "sticky" in the sense that an invisible stream of energy will always connect any two objects that have been connected in any way in the past.
14. Of all the forms of energy, "L" energy is the one best and longest known and written about. It is described in ancient occult and spiritual documents as the intrinsic vital force of all creation.
15. Two of the oldest established forms of medicine, Chinese and Japanese medicine are based on subtle energy, which is called "Qui" or "Chi" in China and "Ki" in Japan.
16. So pervasive is "L" energy that indigenous peoples and ancient religious systems have given it over one hundred different names and base their healing systems on it. In India and Tibet, this energy is called "prana", Polynesians call it "mana", and the Sufis called it "barak". Jews in the cabalistic tradition call it "yesod." The Iroquois call it "orendam", the Ituraea pygmies "megbe", and Christians call it the "Holy Spirit."
17. Many modern psychologists have dealt with and named "L" energy. They have used names such as "the fifth force" and "X" energy. Wilhem Reich called it "organum", Freud : called it "libido", Franz Anton Mesmer called it "animal magnetism", Karl von Reichenbach called it "odic force." Psychologists in Russia used to call it "biplasma."

18. The heart may convey "L" energy along with its electrical activity. While the normal frequency range of electrical activity in the brain is between 0 and 100 cycles per second (CPS), most of the brain's electrical activity hovers between 0 and 30 CPS. The heart's normal frequency is 250 CPS. Since "L" energy can travel within other forms of energy, the heart may be the most powerful sender and receiver of that energy.
19. One of the oldest sources of healing lesson, yoga literature, refers to centers of "L" energy as "chakras" from the Sanskrit word for "wheel", describing spinning vortices of energy.
20. While many persons in the bioscience community do not recognize "L" energy, many report its influence and attempt to incorporate its power in their healing.
