Medical Mystery or Miracle?

Dr. Chauncey W. Crandall IV, who serves at the Palm Beach Cardiovascular Clinic, in Palm Beach Gardens, Florida, made a dramatic presentation at the 4th Annual World Christian Doctors Network Conference in Miami County, Florida.

♦ A 53 year-old man had a massive heart attack in the emergency room of Garden's Hospital. The medical team worked on him for over 40 minutes, without success, and then declared him dead. They called Dr. Crandall in to evaluate the patient. The nurse was preparing his body for the morgue when, says Dr. Crandall, "The Holy Spirit told me to turn around and pray for that man. I went to the side of the stretcher, where his body was being prepared. There was no life in the man. His face, feet and arms were completely black with death. I sat next to his body and I prayed, 'Lord, Father; how am I going to pray for this man? He's dead. What can I do?' All of a

sudden, these words came out of my mouth, 'Father, God, I cry out for the soul of this man if he does not know You as his Lord and Saviour, please raise him from the dead right now, in Jesus name.' And then all of a sudden a heart beat showed up; it was a normal beat. Then after a couple of minutes, he started moving and mumbling words."

♦ Asked if there had been any brain damage to the patient, Dr Crandall responded, "No, his brain was completely normal." He continued, "I would just like to say to my colleagues and physicians out there, that the Lord is real. We've seen many miracles and we pray for our patients daily. There is not one week that goes by that we don't see a mighty miracle in our office. The people need this; they need the power of Christ in their life and they need the power of Christ for healing." ACT: Fully Human, Fully Alive through the Holy Spirit

Fully Human, Fully Alive, the title of a book, comes to mind, as I think of the Lord's beloved ACT organization. *What does it mean to be "fully alive" in ACT?* I think of the International Conference that

takes place each Fall and the healing and direction that ACT members receive from it. I am also reminded of several regional conferences when the Holy Spirit was leading and the mood was "alive."

Those who attended the Region 16 (Texas) conference in 2006 will remember with great joy, as I do, the powerful display and movement of the gifts of the Holy Spirit, *permitted* under the leadership of Gail Golla. I use the word "*permitted*," as we know that we (even ACT members), can squelch the plan of the Holy Spirit, by making too many of our own plans and not listening and/or following. We must be willing to *follow the Spirit into the mystery*, as it happened at this conference. At the recent San Diego Conference, I loved that Pastor Joe Johnson was free to give a prophetic Word during the opening session. He did not wait on the Word Gift, but sought discernment and gave the Word that was meant for the night. Dr. Georgie Rodiger felt free to tell her story in such a genuine way, rolling with the movement of the Holy Spirit. Fr. Claudio was literally "jumping" with Words of healing flowing from the Holy Spirit during the Saturday night charismatic Mass which he celebrated. This is exciting, this is alive, and this is ACT in action. There was much more at this conference with Fr. Peter Menninger and Sister Stephen Culhane. WOW!

There is more for us, too, as members in ACT. Outside the exciting conferences, how is the Holy Spirit leading each of us, so that the gifts are

sought and flowing, as we take Him into our clinical practices, our offices, our hospitals, our prayer ministries, and our businesses? Do we pause and listen for the Holy Spirit's plan before our actions with clients or patients or prayer partners instead of "going it" on our own?

Pausing, listening, and following the Holy Spirit - Now that would be fully human, fully alive in my mind. We will see radical transformation if we allow the Holy Spirit to let us participate in the healing process. Let us attend the conferences, learn, be healed, and integrate all into our work and ministries. Be ACT healers with the Heart of Jesus. Then is Jesus' heart made available to the hungry and the broken hearted, then are the prisoners set free. The Holy Spirit is waiting for you to say YES. Let the mystery and joy begin!

SCRIPTURE

Reading Ruth

T. H. Hicks, Ph.D.

The narrator of Ruth begins the book by plunging his readers into a somber mood with mention of famine, exile, three deaths in a single household, three widows.



But then Yahweh is presented as working positively on behalf of the widow, Naomi, and one bright burst follows another; goodness grows out of goodness. The fact that her husband owned a small piece of land in Bethlehem, and her desire for the consolation of familiar customs and surroundings, draws Naomi home. She tells her daughters-in-law (also widowed) to stay in their own homeland and remarry, fashion new lives for themselves. Orpha weeps, kisses Naomi, accepts her counsel, and slips from the Book of Ruth. The other daughter-in-law, Ruth, hears here mother-in-law three times call out, "Daughter, turn back," and spiraling down to us through the ardors of three thousand years, we hear Ruth's incandescent reply:

Entreat me not to leave you or to return from following you; for where you go I will go, and where you lodge I will

lodge: Your people shall be my people, and your God my God. Where you die I will die, and there will I be buried.

That stupendous expression of loyalty and love! Soon we encounter the fruits of that tenacious fidelity and generosity. Difficulties give way to happy events, as the brave and tender man, Boaz, comes into the women's lives. He is the essence of gentility – protective, respectful, generous, courtly in speech and manner. In the end everybody wins, and Ruth becomes King David's great-grandmother.

The essence of the story of the Book of Ruth takes place during March, April, and May, when Spring is holding high festival and the world is smiling. The story gives a sense of the good that is around us and how generosity and faith bear fruit; no love is ever wasted.

Heartening Message

Above all, there is the theology which the book affirms – that of the hidden but absolute divine causality. Yahweh has no speaking part, but His presence and control are everywhere, often concealed in purely human coincidences and schemes. The Book of Ruth gives us the reassurance that an invisible force is working behind the scenes; God is directing the play. And the heartening message is that every prayer in the book finds an answer in the course of the plot.

AN OLD VISION, A NEW CALL: NOTES FROM THE CONFERENCES

Images of past conferences (and themes of outreach) come to mind. There was Fr. Greg Boyle speaking at ACT San Diego in 2005 about his work with street gangs; of violent youth who had hurt and killed others, and who themselves had been hurt, marginalized, and felt no hope. He shared the difficulty he faced forming the Home Boys program, and the trouble in bringing these youths into the neighborhood; how it frightened and angered the people at the Mission Church who wanted nothing to do with Home Boys. And there was the Mexican doctor and his wife at Glorietta in the early eighties who spoke to us of working with the people who lived in the dump of Juarez, when ACT was still young, and fresh with a vision for outreach. In their humble eloquence, they talked about how all of us, in our excess of life style, create the dump, the ghetto, the tenement house.

I thought of our daughter—who has worked with the homeless system and non-profits for the last nine years, and who currently works with homeless kids in a big city in California, and the trouble she has experienced getting help from the religious establishment. Difficult as it is to stay in the system, she stays because she believes in these kids.

And more recently, in one of the closing talks at the Arkansas conference, Reverend Joe Johnson summed up the edge we face ourselves in Christian healthcare. He spoke about the need and desire of his own heart—not just to talk about Jesus—but to do what Jesus does. He simply reminded us that Jesus does what he sees the Father doing. That's the heart of what we do, and who we are. The call to renewal, and outreach, to doing what the Father does—continues to be the gift that is asked of ACT.

Prayers of Protection

Why should we pray protection when beginning ministry? The logic is very simple. In ministering to an individual, we risk attracting the attention of any demonic entities that may be harassing that person. Nobody gives up power easily, and if there is an area wherein the demonic have claimed rights in someone's life, and ministry is going to break their hold, they are not going to be happy. Think of a child throwing a temper tantrum. In order to get his own way the child acts out. So, too, with the demonic. Recognizing that they are losing control, they simply try harder. Prayers of Protection, then, are a proactive method of circumventing such potential problems, and invoking God's power.

These prayers are not limited to ministry. Other uses could be when traveling, staying in a hotel, visiting hospitals, prisons, or when engaging in any undertaking directed by the Lord. In 1 Peter 5:8 we are reminded that the devil prowls around seeking someone to devour. The more we are working for the Lord, the more likely we are to attract this unwanted attention.

A word of caution: prayers of protection are not about walking around in fear, and seeing demons everywhere. Rather they are tools for exercising our authority in Christ, and accessing God's power, and are very effective when used this way.

A PRAYER FOR PROTECTION

In the name of Jesus Christ, and by the power of his Cross and his Blood, we bind up the power of any evil spirits and command them not to block our prayers. We bind up the powers of earth, air, water, fire, the netherworld, and the satanic forces of nature.



We break any curses, hexes or spells sent against us and declare them null and void. We break the assignments of any spirits sent against us and send them back to Jesus to deal with them as he will. Lord we ask you to bless our enemies by sending your Holy Spirit to lead them to repentance and conversion.

Furthermore, we bind all interaction and communication in the world of spirits as it affects us and our ministry.

STRATEGIC PLAN 2006-2009: THE PROPHETIC COMMUNITY IN ACTION

Action and Implementation

During the 2007 Annual Board and Leadership Retreat (June 07) the Board, along with various Committee Chairs, Regional Coordinators, and Specialty Group Chairs evaluated the progress of the Strategic Plan and updated all Strategic Objectives in the 2006 – 2009 Plan. Then the Board prioritized three specific Strategic Objectives for emphasis during this year, 2008.

The three prioritized Strategic Objectives for 2008 are:

- **Goal 4, Strategic Objective 7: Develop communication/collaboration with other organizations and constituencies.**
- **Goal 2, Strategic Objective 1: Increase opportunities for each member to contribute to his/her region. (This includes an emphasis on providing mentoring.)**
- **Goal 3, Strategic Objective 2: Increase membership of Specialty groups.**

In the yearly planning/implementation cycle the focus of attention then moves to the Executive Offices of the Board and to the Committee Chairs, Regional Coordinators and Specialty Group Chairs who fashion the specific, masurable, achievable, realistic, timely and yours (SMARTY) Goals and Action Plans for their part in implementing the prioritized Strategic Objectives. The Board is committed to facilitating all levels of ACT leadership in articulating SMARTY Goals for their part in implementing the prioritized Strategic Objectives and other important work.

Following are three SMARTY Goals fashioned for the above Strategic Objectives that illustrate the work currently being done.

- For Goal 4, Strategic Objective 7. The Chairperson of The Program Development Committee will attend, in 08, 1-2 conferences of other organizations related to ACT's mission to establish links with their members and will secure tables at these conferences for distribution of ACT materials, e.g. International and Regional Conference flyers, membership applications, etc.
- For Goal 2, Strategic Objective 1. Region 17: Interview present and past members of the region in order to hear their needs and concerns, and to convey that ACT needs them and their gifts. Document the needs, concerns and potential contributions expressed. To be completed by 2-29-08.

- For Goal 3, Strategic Objective 2. Region 1 and 2. Complete at least three activities by Spring 09: A Healing Mass, An ACT booth at a job fair and Presentations at a medical school, a school of social work, and a nursing school.

Importantly all of this work flows from the ACT Vision and Mission and from specific values and emphases that are discerned to be God's direction for us at the time.

Presently the Board and Leadership are focusing on **1) Reaching out - evangelizing healthcare professionals with the healing ministry of Jesus and with what ACT offers and 2) Developing a welcoming, encouraging, mentoring culture within ACT.**

The revised 2006-2009 Strategic Plan is available for study on the ACT website in the members area. As you study the 2006 – 2009 Strategic Plan and the three prioritized Strategic Objectives for 2008 consider your role and responsibility in achieving these Objectives. Every member is an essential and vital part of implementing the ACT Vision and Mission. The Board encourages each ACT member to write her/his own SMARTY Goals for 08, articulating each of our intended contributions to implementing ACT's Mission and achieving the prioritized Strategic Objectives.

In the next issue of InterACT, this article will be followed-up with instructions for writing specific, masurable, achievable, realistic, timely, and yours (SMARTY) Goals.

An Inspiring and Encouraging Prophetic Word In 2007 I (Gloria Tipton) heard Bishop Earl Paulk, Jr. pastor of an inter-denominational church based in Atlanta, Georgia, present a message addressed to the leadership of all Christian communities. community are solution-oriented with a clear vision of personal and corporate mission. Those serving are likened to a fresh stream of living water, rather than a stagnant pool of old hurts and abuses. Even during years of famine they remain prosperous and healthy. Lastly, Paulk exhorted all leaders present to identify and explore seven requirements of the prophetic community: 1. Under Command; 2. Trustworthy; 3. Permeated by true agape love; 4. Implementers of God's direction with great boldness; 5. Given to creativity and productivity; 6. A giving community with an abundance mentality verse scarcity mentality; 7. A community of purpose.

Over the past eight years of Strategic Planning within ACT those gathered for prayer and reflection trusted the discernment coming forth from the "God of the gathering." As a community of purpose inspired with confidence in His trustworthiness we continue a forward movement toward following the command of the Holy Spirit who supplies our every need for the implementation of God's direction with great boldness, creativity and productivity, permeated by love.

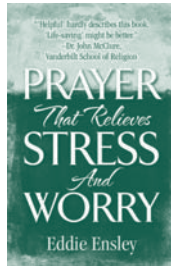
